Hope is energy that is focused on one's goals and is a path that leads one to one's goals. Hope is a process of thinking about one goal, with motivation to achieve these goals (agency), and ways to achieve these goals (pathways) (Snyder, 2000)

Hope plays an important role in romantic relationships where individuals, especially women, place hopes in their partners, such as hopes of being loved, cared for, cared for, and hopes for the future. Seeing the importance of hope, researchers are very interested in studying more deeply whether hope changes the way adult women view love. The higher an individual's hope, the more it increases trust in their partner. Vice versa, the lower an individual's hope, then the individual's trust also decreases, especially in love relationships romantic.(Jukiro et al., 2024)

Talking about love and expressions of love certainly cannot be separated from Sternberg's (1987) love triangle theory which consists of three components. The first is intimacy. (Yudisia, 2013) said that intimacy can be expressed by sending messages means love, giving surprise gifts even if they are small or cheap, eating together, preparing things your partner needs, listening to your partner's complaints, supporting your partner's hobbies, and also understanding your partner.

Second is passion. According to Dariyo (2008), passion can be expressed by giving physical touch to a partner, such as stroking their hair, holding hands, embracing, kissing, or having sexual relations. Third, namely commitment. Dariyo (2008) says that commitment can be expressed in any action or effort that increases a sense of trust, a sense of acceptance, a feeling of worth, and also a feeling of being loved by one's partner.

## RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

This journal uses a qualitative methodology. (Creswel,j, 2010) states that qualitative research is a way to research and understand the meaning ascribed to social or humanitarian problems. The focus of this research is phenomenology. ## RESULT AND DISCUSSION

Based on the results of research conducted on 4 respondents whose ages range from 20-25 years, it can be seen that they have quite high hopes for their partners, such as spending quality time together, then receiving and giving gifts (acts of service) and also giving physical touch to express his love. The various forms of expression of love from these respondents are in accordance with the form of love language from (Chapman, 2017) When the research was conducted, researchers began to observe various aspects related to whether hope changed the way adult women viewed love. During the interview, the researcher took 4 important things about whether hope changed the respondent's perspective on love:

1. On the first day of conducting research with a 20 year old woman with the initials VO, the researcher concluded that for VO, love can form hopes and often these hopes are related to certain expectations regarding relationships.

VO has high hopes for love, he often looks for an ideal partner, a perfect relationship and eternal love, but sometimes on the contrary, VO also has more realistic expectations, he may appreciate the process and growth in relationships more.

- 2. On the second day, the researchers conducted an interview with a 20 year old woman with the initials AS. The researchers concluded that it was important that expectations also influence decisions in relationships. AS has a strong hope of getting married and having a family, he will be quicker to commit to a relationship and AS is also more focused on self-development, perhaps delaying marriage or choosing not to marry at all.
- 3. On the third day, the researcher conducted an interview with a 24 year old woman with the initials YZ. The researcher concluded that it was important that hope influenced her perspective towards her partner, where in this case YZ put hope in her partner to be able to fulfill their dreams together, such as being able to develop a business together, and do things that are more positive and productive. This hope influences the way he views love, according to YZ, love is not only about romantic relationships but can also be used to build great opportunities to achieve success together.
- 4. On the 4th day the researchers conducted research with a 20 year old woman with the initials MS. The researchers concluded that it was important that hope in a romantic relationship changes many things in her life. When MS was in high school, he was often ostracized by his classmates. At difficult times there was only her partner who always accompanied her to get through this difficult process. MS's hope at that time only wanted to have friends and people to share stories with. This hope that MS places on her partner, changes MS's perspective on love, if before starting a relationship, MS always felt inferior and lacked self-confidence and only considered love as normal things that children her age do, but this hope changed MS's perspective, Now he sees that love is not just a romantic relationship or just something that kids his age do. Now he sees that love is an extraordinary thing that can change a person's life.

Based on interviews, researchers concluded that hope changes the way adult women view love. Where researchers found 5 interesting things about why hope can change the way adult women view love:

- 1. A perfect love story, women often watch and read lots of romantic love story novels and often have the hope of having a perfect love story.
- 2. Expectations about being loved are romantic, where women have high hopes to be loved, cared for and loved.
- 3. Love is something that can rise from adversity and early adult women have hope for a happier life.
- 4. Fear of failure, early adult women have high expectations for love in relationships and tend to avoid the risk of entering into a serious relationship.

5. Motivation to become a better person, the hope of being loved and cared for encourages women to develop themselves and become the best version of themselves.

Based on the results of research conducted by researchers, it can be concluded that love is definitely based on hope, which often determines the continuation of a romantic relationship, love is not always about a happy relationship and romantic love can also be extraordinary things that can be done. with a partner.
